## Cambridge iGCSE - Exam Technique

## Suggested Technique

- Read Passage A (5 minutes).
- Complete Question 1 (40 minutes).
- Read Passage B (5 minutes).
- Complete Question 3 ( 40 minutes).
- Complete Question 2 ( 30 minutes).


## Question 1 (20 Marks: 15 for Reading, 5 for Writing Quality)

> Based on Passage A.
$>$ Spend $40-45$ minutes on this question (includes reading time).
$>$ Aim for $2-3$ pages (higher levels must use additional pages - label them clearly).
$>$ Highlight keywords in the question.
$>$ Follow bullet points to the letter - equal amounts of writing for each bullet point.
$>$ Must write in paragraphs - you will lose a mark if it is not.
> DO NOT COMMENT ON THE TEXT.
> DO NOT COPY ANYTHING - YOU MUST USE YOUR OWN WORDS.
$>$ Likely tasks are: formal report, journal, speech, news report, dialogue or interview.
$>$ This is primarily a reading assessment - you are being marked on your ability to understand, locate and use information from a text.
$>$ The marks available for writing are awarded for the use of language (so that it is convincing), structure and technical accuracy.

## Question 2 (10 Marks: 10 for Reading)

* Spend 30-35 minutes on this question.
* Aim for 2-3 pages (higher levels must use additional pages - label them clearly).
* Before analysing evidence, you need an overview of how language is used by the author in each specific paragraph.
* NOT PEE paragraphs - try to use SWAT (P. 28 in your planner) for individual words/phrases.
* No need to make Points: just start analysing language and its effects.
* Base your ideas on images that the text suggests.
* Look for 'shades' of meaning - what else could that evidence suggest?
* Try to have 4 pieces of evidence per paragraph try to have different types of evidence i.e. do NOT select 4 similes or 4 verbs.
* Always consider the effect on the reader e.g. sensory and/or emotional.


## Question 3 (20 Marks: $\mathbf{1 5}$ for Reading, 5 for Writing Quality)

$\checkmark \quad$ Based on Passages A and B.
$\checkmark$ Spend 40-45 minutes on this question (includes reading time).
$\checkmark$ SUMMARISE is the key word - find relevant information and put it into your own words.
$\checkmark$ Find at least 15 points (aim for 20) over the two paragraphs (1 mark for each up to 15).
$\checkmark$ Write in full sentences - not note form / bullet points.
$\checkmark$ You can use words from the text, but you will be penalised if you quote more than 2 consecutive words as this is considered 'copying'.
$\checkmark \quad 1$ paragraph per text.
$\checkmark \quad$ No more than 1 page (unless your handwriting is particularly large).
$\checkmark$ Use a range of connectives to link ideas.
$\checkmark$ Make it clear, fluent and as brief as possible.
$\checkmark$ Only focus on the information that is asked for - do not get side-tracked.
$\checkmark$ This is primarily a reading assessment - you are being marked on your ability to understand, locate and use information from a text.
$\checkmark$ The marks available for writing are awarded for the focus on the question, clarity, fluency and using your own words (not directly copying from the text).
